

Pupil Premium Grant 2015/16

What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil Premium was introduced in 2011. It is additional funding to publicly funded schools in England and Wales, to raise the attainment of eligible pupils and close the gap between them and their peers. The Pupil Premium Grant is paid to schools according to the number of pupils who:

- Are registered as eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any point in the last six years (known as Ever 6).
- Have been in local authority care for six months or longer and are aged 4 to 15 (CLA).
- Have parents serving in the armed forces (CSF).

Allocations in 2015/16.

FSM £1300 per child.

CLA £1900 per child.

CSF £300 per child.

Our allocation.

We have 16 pupils registered for Pupil Premium Grant at Brereton.

Funding in this academic year was received for 8 pupils: £11,600

Percentage of children registered for Pupil Premium funding at Brereton.

8.8% of NOR.

Percentage of children receiving Pupil Premium Funding at Brereton.

4.4% of NOR.

What was the Pupil Premium funding used for?

- Funding extra-curricular activities including day visits and theatre trips to enhance the curriculum, and residential visits to Beeston (Y2 - 3 children), York (Y4 - 3 children), Pensarn (Y5,6 - 6 children).
- Additional teaching and learning opportunities through the use of trained TAs, HLTA, in-class support from unqualified teacher or external agencies to enable children to make improved progress and raise their standards of achievement.
- Provision of Reading Recovery resources including ECAR teacher hours.
- Provision of Better Reading Partners intervention.
- Funding of Fischer Family Trust reading.
- Funding of Wave 3 maths intervention.
- Providing resources for the Inference Group intervention.
- Funding the Reception Literacy Programme for years 1 and 2.
- Music lessons in Y5.
- Purchase of 'Power of 1' and 'Power of 2' catch-up maths programme.

Impact of PPG funding at Brereton.

The percentages below are Pupil Premium children only, across the school. They are based on end of year summative assessments for years 3,4 and 5. They are based on SATs scores for Y2 and on teacher assessment for Y6.
