#### **Parent Pay Arrears**

Thank you for your support in clearing ParentPay areas. We continue to have over £5000 owed on Parent Pay for school lunches, snack and wrap around care. Please speak to us if you are experiencing financial difficulty. Otherwise, please could we ask you to ensure all debts are paid by February half term. We appreciate that things may be tight after Christmas but we are still required to pay Cheshire East catering at a set time. After half term, snack and wrap around care will not be offered if significant arrears remain.

Those pupils who receive Pupil Premium have free school meals, as well as support with the cost of trips. The local authority are also offering a Household Support Fund to these families, which help with energy and food costs.

#### Household Support Fund

Cheshire East Council have confirmed that Household Support Vouchers of £20 per child will be sent out before half term. These will be sent to all families eligible for free school meals.
