Nature of support 2012/13
Support for individual pupils has included additional teaching assistant support for one to one interventions. We have also continued the employment of a teaching assistant to support pupils with additional needs. Interventions include Reading Recovery, Reception Literacy Programme, Fisher Family Trust Wave Three, Better Reading Partners, Inference Skills, and one-to-one tuition sessions. Money has been allocated to fund extra-curricular activities, day trips and residential visits.

Curriculum focus of Pupil Premium Grant spending 2012/13
Reading and writing one-to-one support and small group interventions. The focus has been during school time and out of school hours.

Measuring the impact of Pupil Premium Grant spending
School evaluates the impact of each pupil at the end of each term. This evaluation provides a focus on academic progress, and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the intervention. In 2012/13, each pupil was carefully assessed and tracked. Reading: Pupils in receipt of the pupil premium grant made above average progress with a point score average of 4.2 points progress. Writing: Pupils in receipt of the pupil premium grant made above average progress with a point score average of 4.3 points progress. Maths: Pupils in receipt of the pupil premium grant made above average progress with a point score average of 4.0 points progress.
