

Pupil Premium Grant 2014/15

What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil Premium was introduced in 2011. It is additional funding to publicly funded schools in England and Wales, to raise the attainment of eligible pupils and close the gap between them and their peers. The Pupil Premium Grant is paid to schools according to the number of pupils who:

- Are registered as eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any point in the last six years (known as Ever 6).
- Have been in local authority care for six months or longer and are aged 4 to 15 (CLA).
- Have parents serving in the armed forces (CSF).

Allocations in 2014/15.

FSM £1300 per child.

CLA £1900 per child.

CSF £300 per child.

Our allocation.

Total amount of Pupil Premium funding received for 8 pupils: £11,600

What was the Pupil Premium funding used for?

- Funding extra-curricular activities including day visits to enhance the curriculum, and residential visits.
- Additional teaching and learning opportunities through the use of trained TAs, HLTA or external agencies to enable children to make improved progress and raise their standards of achievement.
- Provision of Reading Recovery resources including ECAR teacher hours.
- Provision of Better Reading Partners intervention.
- Funding of Fischer Family Trust reading.

- Providing resources for the Inference Group intervention.
- The purchase of Kindle electronic books for years 5 and 6.
- Funding the Reception Literacy Programme for years 1 and 2.
