Dear Parents,

Thank you for your patience this week. We have been incredibly busy working on a number of different scenarios, whilst also creating action plans and risk assessments, ready for the **possible** re-opening of school on 1st June. Our main objective this week has been to gain further clarity around the guidance issued by the Department of Education on Monday evening. This continues to be updated so we are not able to share our final plans with you at the moment.

On Tuesday, CDAT heads are meeting to share their plans and have them approved by the Trust. Once this agreement has been secured we will outline the timetable for return. This is a huge responsibility for us and we do not take it lightly. We know that whilst children are missing school, parents and staff feel worried and have lots of questions.

When the time comes for some children to return, we will be doing everything we can to follow the guidance issued by the DfE to keep everyone safe. Here are some of the measures that will be in place:

- Children will be in smaller classes (max 15) with one teacher and one teaching assistant.
- Children will be encouraged to wash their hands at regular intervals and will be supervised doing so.
- Play times and lunch times will be staggered.
- Children will be provided with their own set of resources.
- Equipment will be cleaned after use.
- Cleaning will take place throughout the school day.

- Stringent cleaning measures will be in place at the end of the school day.
- There will be a weekly deep clean.
- Parents will be given staggered times to arrive at school and to collect children.
- Families will be encouraged to continue to observe the current social distancing guidance out of school so must not be mixing with other households.

These are challenging times for us all. Many of you will be anxious to get back to work but many will be worried about sending children back to school. School staff understand and share those anxieties for their own children and families. We will do everything we can to respond to the guidance given by the government but will also be ensuring that we do this safely. We will respect every parents decision and we ask that you do the same.

Next week, we will give you as much information as possible. We also draft a letter to the children, which you may share with your child if you wish. In the meantime, I have attached the Government guidance for parents which may answer some of your questions. Please note, that government guidance is not statutory and as a school, we can choose how and when we re-open and we will do so in a way which best suits our school.

Your support throughout the past few weeks and the dedication of our staff team has made me incredibly proud of our Brereton family. Thank-you so much for working with us and for your patience in very uncertain times.







































