Good Friday 2nd April Facebook Service

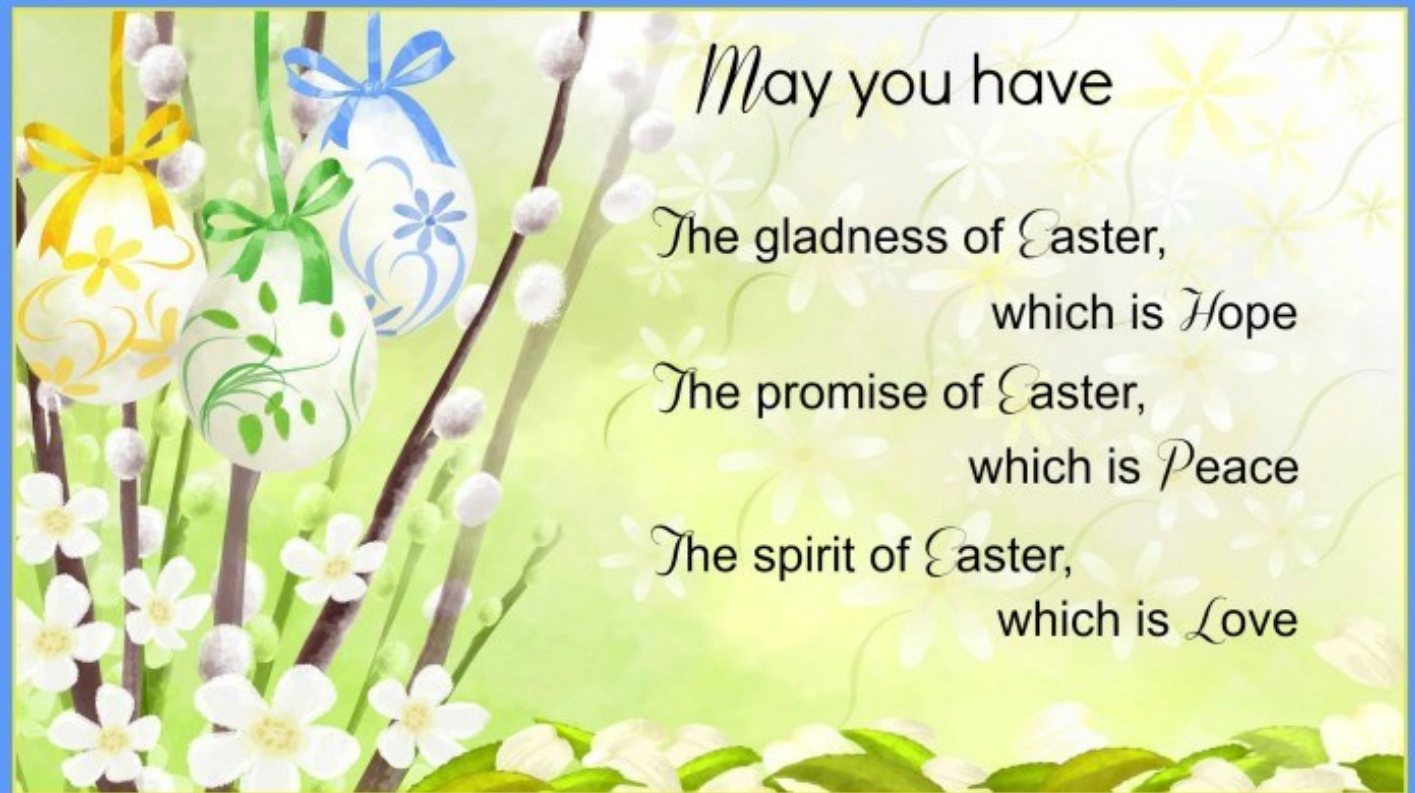
Easter Sunday 4th April 10.30am Service in church followed by Easter Egg Rolling

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Covid Testing

If a child or adult have covid symptoms they must still access a PCR test at a testing centre EVEN IF their LFT test done at home is negative. This is because the LFT test is designed to identify asymptomatic cases and they are less accurate than a PCR test. You can book a PCR test by visiting <https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test>

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The difference between COVID-19 tests

Do you have symptoms of Covid-19?

No but I've been asked to take a test due to work reasons or a local outbreak

Yes

Lateral flow test (LFT)



This is a COVID test for people **without** symptoms. You take a sample from your nose and throat and get a result in **30 minutes**

Standard Covid test (PCR)



This is a COVID test for people **with** symptoms. You take a sample from your nose and throat and get a result **within 3 days**

What does the result tell me?

The test gives a snapshot of who currently has a COVID infection.
The test does not entirely rule out a person having COVID

Lateral Flow Test (LFT)



Negative result

- You **must** continue to follow "hands, face, space" guidance to stop COVID spreading
- You do not need to self-isolate (unless specifically told to)



Positive result

- You should **self-isolate immediately** and follow NHS Test and Trace guidance
- You should take another test, called a **PCR test**, to confirm if you have COVID (by visiting a testing site or using a home kit)



Standard Covid test (PCR)



Negative result

- You **must** continue to follow "hands, face, space" guidance to stop COVID spreading
- You do not need to self-isolate (unless specifically told to)



Positive result

- You should **self-isolate immediately** and follow NHS Test and Trace guidance



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
