



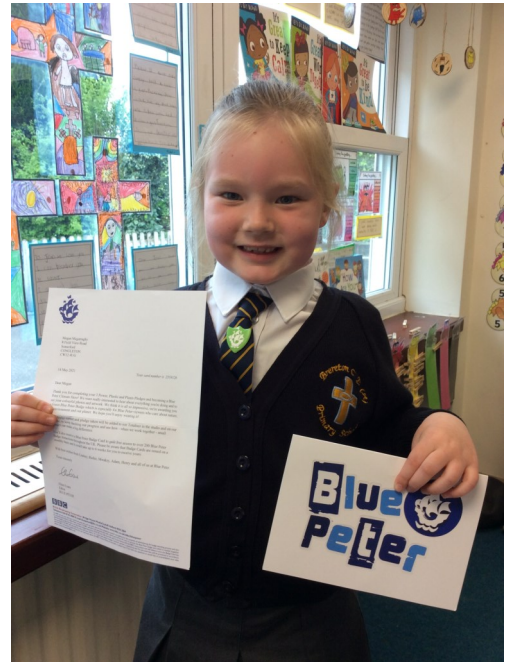
Netball

Why is reading so important?

Children who enjoy reading are three times more likely to have better health and mental wellbeing than children who don't enjoy it.

Children who read books often are more likely to gain higher results in maths, vocabulary and spelling tests,

Studies have shown that those who read for pleasure have higher levels of self-esteem and a greater ability to cope with difficult situations.

Reading for pleasure has been associated with better sleeping patterns.
