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A letter from school council

Dear Parents,

We are the school council. We have looked around our school and thought about areas we like and areas we want to improve.

Our least favourite area is the pond area on our playground. At the moment we can't use it because the wood is rotten and it is not safe.

We thought about what to turn it in to. We decided that it would be a good idea to turn it in to a sensory garden: a quiet and calm area for everyone to enjoy.

Our school has grown over the last few years and there aren't many quiet spaces. We talked to some children in school who would greatly appreciate a calm area to help them manage their emotions, but we think this area would be enjoyed by everyone.

We would like to include a covered seating area like a small summer house, a storage shed, raised flower beds, scented plants, a water feature, things to touch and things to look at.
