#### Bonfire and Fireworks Night




We hope you can all join us at this fantastic event organised by our brilliant PTA. All proceeds from any PTA event do go straight back to helping with projects in our school so we hope to



Miss Coomber, Mr Mason, Mrs Hartley and Miss Hayes.




#### Diorama Competition






## 500 Words Competition



# Well done to Jessica in Year 2 for passing her Level 1 swimming award. Amazing!




#### Rock Stars Battle:

The winner will be announced in the first week back—good luck!







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
