On Mt. Carmel, Elijah said to the people of Israel, "How long will you waver between two opinions? If the Lord is God, follow him; but if Baal is God, follow him" (<u>1 Kings</u> <u>18:21</u>). The people remained noncommittal at that point. Elijah then challenged the prophets of Baal to prepare a bull as an offering for their god—Elijah would do the same—with this catch: they could light no fire on their altar. The God who answered with <u>fire from the sky</u> would be considered the true God (verses 22–25).

Then God did what Baal could never do: the fire of the LORD fell from heaven and consumed the burnt offering *and* the wood *and* the stones *and* the dust, "and also licked up the water in the trench" (verse 38). The people of Israel bowed down and declared the Lord as God (verse 39).

Please come dressed in playground wear and bring your disco outfit in a named bag if you want to change after school.


