David Coleman—Royal Marines Public Speaker

Last week we invited David Coleman, an ex-marine who almost lost his life on the job. He spoke to us about building resilience and trying new things in order to achieve our full potential. He told us of all the choices he has had to make in order to get where he is today and many of the things he has done, he didn't want to but knew he had to challenge himself in order to learn and grow. During one of his tours of Afghanistan, he was hit by a grenade, leading to him needing life-saving surgery. He was given the chance to go home once he had recovered, but refused as he knew his team where depending on him and he wanted to continue to help people safely escape the war zone. He could have taken the "easy option" but never did. He wanted us to all challenge ourselves in order to achieve as things worth having often don't come easily. What a truly inspiring story!

Worship—Love God and Love One Another

In worship this week we looked at Jesus being baptised. We thought about baptism and why people are baptised. We wondered why Jesus would need to be baptised. We decided that it was His way to show us who he was and how we should live.

He also showed support for John—that God believed in him.

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Parent Council Constitution

We are setting up a new Parent Council Constitution—Do you have the time to represent your child's year group? Do you want to get more involved in school life? Could you liaise with parents in your year group, collate any celebrations and thanks and any constructive ideas and attend a termly meeting at school?

NB The use of the term 'parents' in this constitution is respectfully deemed to include all carers of pupils at the school.

OBJECTIVES:

The objectives of the Parent Council are:

To work in partnership with the school to create a welcoming school which is inclusive for all parents, children and staff.

To promote partnership between the school, its staff, its pupils, PTA, Governors and all parents.

To identify and represent the views of parents on the education provided by the school and other matters affecting the education and welfare of the pupils.

MEMBERSHIP

The membership will be a minimum of 7 and a maximum of 14 parents of children attending the school. The Headteacher and Deputy Headteacher are also members of the Parent Council.

Any parent of a child at the school can volunteer to be a member of the Parent Council. In the event that the number of volunteers exceeds the number of places set out in the constitution, members will be selected by a parent vote. The vote count will be supervised by an independent person.

Members of the Parent Council will be selected for a period of one year, after which they may put themselves forward for re-selection if they wish. If a member of the Parent Council ceases to have a child at the school within their period of membership, they will cease to be a parent member of the Parent Council and a new member will be elected.

Parents of Children in Reception will be eligible to join the parent council from the summer term of their Child's Reception year.

The Chair and Clerk will be agreed by Parent Council members immediately following its formation. A Vice

Chair will also be agreed. The Vice Chair should be willing to step in for the Chair if need be but need not necessarily become Chair when that position becomes vacant.

ACCOUNTABILITY

The Parent Council is accountable to the Governing Body of Brereton Primary School and will make a report to it at least once each term on its activities on behalf of all the parents.

MEETINGS

An Annual General Meeting of the Parent Council will be held at a time to be agreed. A notice of the meeting including date, time and place will be sent to all parents at least two weeks in advance. The meeting will include: a report on the work of the Parent Council and any subgroups discussion of issues that members of the Parent Forum may wish to raise

the appointment of a Chair, Vice Chair and Secretary Should a vote be necessary to make a decision, each Parent Council member at the meeting will have one vote, with the Chair having a casting vote in the event of a tie. A quorum of 7 parents, from a minimum of 4 year groups will apply. Any two members of the Parent Council can request that an additional meeting be held and all members of the Parent Council will be given at least one week's notice of the meeting.

If a Parent Council member acts in a way that is considered by other members to undermine the objectives of the Parent Council, their membership of the Parent Council shall be terminated if the majority of members agree. Termination of membership would be confirmed in writing to the member.

Copies of the minutes of all meetings will be available to parents of children and to teachers at the school. Copies will be available on the school website.

CONSTITUTION

The Parent Council may change its constitution after obtaining consent from members of the Parent Council. Members of the Parent Council will be sent a copy of any proposed amendment and given reasonable time (minimum two weeks) to

respond to the proposal. The Constitution will be reviewed annually.

The Parent Council will meet at least once every term.




The school disco is back! On Friday 14th of February there will be a school disco for all pupils.

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




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World Book Day








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Our attendance this week is 95.84%
