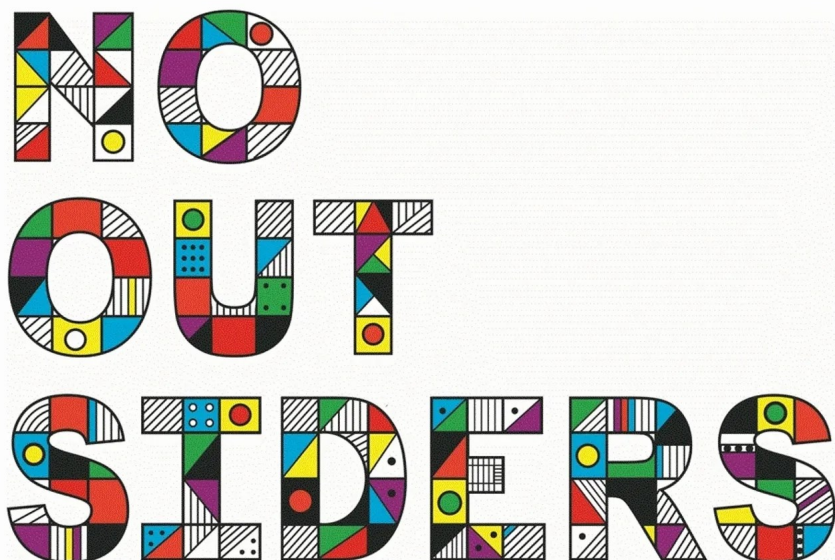

No Outsiders

This week, we were lucky enough to have Andrew Moffat, founder of No Outsiders join us in school. He worked with each class, focussing on the key message 'all different, all welcome.'

No Outsiders uses picture books to encourage children to celebrate their identities and to accept and value others. This is particularly important to us as a church school, where we believe all of God's children are to be valued. The programme supports the Equality Act and themes explore gender, sexuality, race and ethnicity, religion, disability and age, at an age-appropriate level. Sessions reinforce that, in our school, there will be no outsiders: we are all perfectly different and unique. With hate crimes rising each year, we want our children to be the ones who challenge and change perspectives, whilst also respecting the values and beliefs of others.

What is No Outsiders?

Our Vision: Inclusive education, promoting community cohesion to prepare young people and adults for life as global citizens.

Mrs Saunders and I are currently planning on how the programme will enhance our PSHE curriculum. Lessons will be once a half term and we plan to share an outline of the lesson in advance with parents. A presentation for parents will be made available in the new year.

Focus on our visit lessons:

Rec/Y1/2 - Andrew talked to the children about the importance of kindness and letting others play.

Y3/4 - Andrew spoke to us about how everyone is unique and different and how this is something to be celebrated.

We listened to the story of Oliver and discussed how he was different and that made him special and unique. Although he felt lonely at first, he met a friend who was also

different and the story ended with their new friendship. We then all wrote a difference on a post it and put it in an envelope. The children all said 'I'm different' to me and I replied 'you are part of my class.'

Y5/6 - Andrew introduced a book called 'Mixed' where the town had been split into different colours and how when the colours mixed, new colours were created.

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




