Teaching and Learning Review

Our School Improvement Partner carried out a thorough review of teaching and learning on Tuesday this week. Mr Williams has helped us identify areas for improvement and validated our judgements. Thank you to those parents who came over to speak to him in the playground on Tuesday morning. Mr Williams really enjoyed meeting the children and seeing teaching and learning across the school. He identified several areas of outstanding practice here at Brereton such as Behaviour and Safety, Behaviour for Learning and our Early Years Foundation Stage. He praised teaching and learning seeing several examples of outstanding and the rest being good with outstanding elements. It is now our job to focus on reaching outstanding in all areas.

Assessment without Levels

The government has decided that the levels used in education are not clear and easy to understand. All schools are being asked to devise their own assessment systems. As a school we are keen to use a system which is clear to parents, children, teachers and the secondary schools that we feed to. We use assessment to make end of unit judgements, end of year judgements and daily judgements about learning. We use assessment to inform our teaching. We use assessment to show pupil progress. It is a key part of school life. We will be working on our new system across the course of this academic year. We will be working on assessment with the other schools in the Holmes Chapel and Community District Partnership. We hope to be able to share our new system with you all in the summer term and will ask for your feedback on the new system to ensure that it is clear and user friendly. The old levels (1C,1B,1A,2C,2B,2A etc) will continue to be used until the new system is in place.

Items of Clothing

We would like to offer an online payment system for making payments for school visits. This can be done via the Cheshire East ePayment system, the same system as payments for school meals.
