Poetry

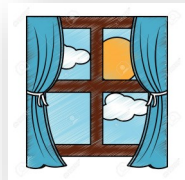
Become a poet and write a haiku about prayer. A haiku is a three lined poem with just seventeen syllables; five in the first line; seven in the second line and five in the third line.

The Future in our Hands

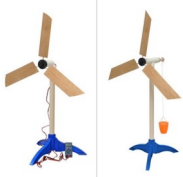
For this STEM (science, technology, engineering and maths) challenge we would like you to design a solution that could change our world for the better.

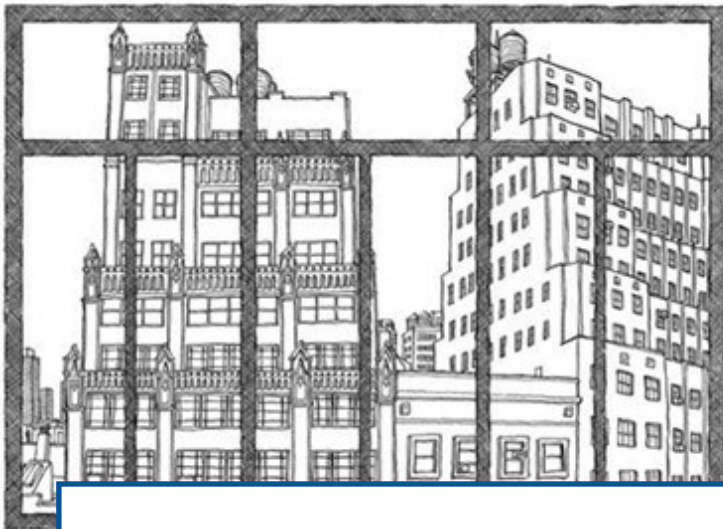
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The World Outside My Window
