Virtual Sports Day

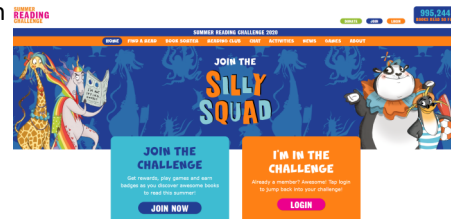
