We have received notification of an incident of threadworm. We would ask parents to talk to their child about the need to wash hands thoroughly with soap and water after using the toilet and dry them properly.

Threadworm is quite common in children but we do need to highlight this problem to ensure early detection and early treatment is sought. Should you have any queries please contact your local GP or Pharmacy for advice.
