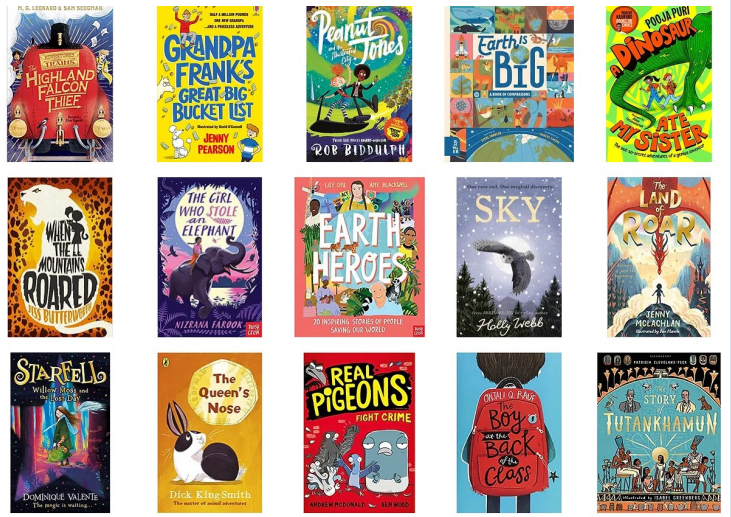
Summer Reading
