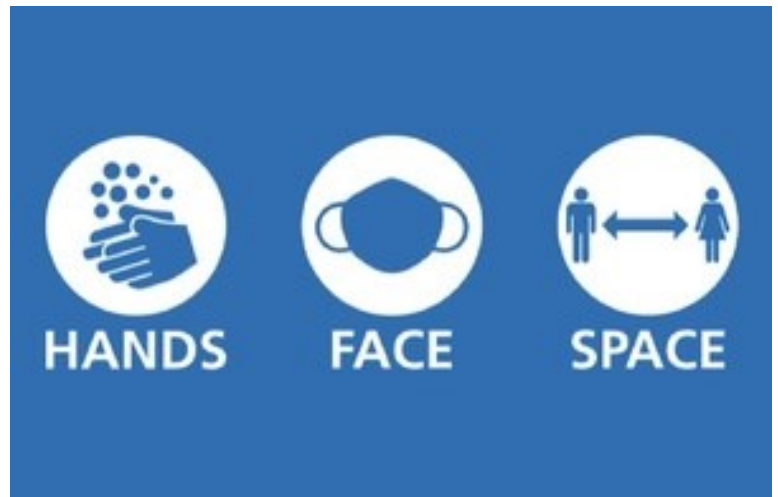

 How many people outdoors?	Six from multiple households from 14 Sep	Up to 15 from up to five households, 2m apart	Up to 30 outdoors	Up to 15 outdoors
