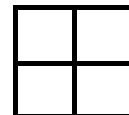

You must choose four two-digit numbers from 1-9 and put one in each box for example:

5	2
1	9

This gives four two-digit numbers:

51 29 52 19

Their sum is 151.

Your challenge is to find four two-digit numbers which add to a total of 100.

How many ways can you find of doing it?
